## INFORMATION FOR 1990 STONE SYMPOSIUM

### Scheduling

The Symposium begins at 4:00 p.m. on Thursday, January 25th, and ends at 1:30 p.m. on Sunday, January 28th. A picnic will follow from 1:30-4:00 p.m. on the beach. Since January 28th is Superbowl Sunday, some of you may want to stay over at the hotel that night for the same rates and hold a Superbowl party. For those with sport-phobias, Sunday will offer an uncrowded afternoon on the beach. You may also want to consider coming to the hotel early since the hotel is offering the same low rates for continuous stays during the month of January.

### Hotel Reservations

To reserve a room, send the enclosed reservation form and the first night's deposit to the Dolphin Beach Resort by December 20, 1989. However, we would appreciate your registering as early as possible because this will increase our chances of reserving a larger number of Gulf view rooms.

### Registration Fee

Each person attending the Symposium should send a check for the \$30 registration fee (made out to Carolyn Ellis) with the enclosed registration form by December 10, 1989. This fee will allow you to participate in all of the activities during the Symposium, including the Friday night banquet, Sunday afternoon picnic on the beach, continental breakfast each morning, coffee and punch breaks, and any scheduled tours.
